

History 1962 – 2010

2010 Hendricks Regional Health achieves Magnet® designation from the American Nurses Credentialing Center.

2009 Hendricks Regional Health and the YMCA of Greater Indianapolis break ground in December on central Indiana's first fully-integrated YMCA and hospital collaboration. The 100,000 square-foot Hendricks Regional Health YMCA will sit on 28.8 acres of land along Highway 36 in Avon and will give both organizations an opportunity to provide health, wellness, nutrition and stress management services to the community. The facility is scheduled to open in 2011.

2008 In June, Hendricks Regional Health began its largest expansion in the hospital's history, a 205,000 square-foot addition that will contain six state-of-the-art operating rooms, 37 private patient rooms, a new cafeteria, central sterile, Center for Diabetes Excellence and more. Scheduled completion date is summer, 2010. In November Hendricks Regional Health announced a partnership with the YMCA to construct a combined fitness center and medical office building in Avon.

2007 In July, Hendricks Regional Health Danville opens Medical Office Building 3, a new three-story structure with six medical offices per floor.

2006 A new 10-bed pediatric unit opens featuring private rooms and a family snack area. In December, PHI Dove Flight medical flight service began operating from Hendricks Regional Health Danville, offering scene response and interfacility medical transport.

2005 In March, Hendricks Regional Health opens first catheterization laboratory, which provides cardiac and peripheral vascular services. Expansions are also completed in radiology, patient financial services and the women's center.

2004 Hendricks Regional Health is the only hospital in Indiana to be named a Top 100 Hospital® for Performance Improvement by Solucient. On April 20, the north expansion opens at Hendricks Regional Health Danville, which features a state-of-the-art emergency department with 27 private patient rooms and a medical unit with 37 private rooms.

2003 On March 24, the Board of Trustees approves the new name for the organization; our medical facilities in Danville, Avon, Brownsburg and Plainfield will all be tied to the organization known as Hendricks Regional Health. The hospital's west tower opens and provides new homes for the cardiopulmonary department, the cardiac rehabilitation department, the pharmacy, neurology and sleep laboratory, Partners In Care and additional conference room space.

2002 Hendricks Community Hospital opens Plainfield Medical Center, which replaces Stafford Pointe Medical Center. Plainfield Medical Center houses physician offices, Hendricks Occupational Medicine, an Immediate Care Center, radiology and laboratory services and physical, occupational and aquatic therapy services. In addition, Hendricks Community Hospital embarks on expansion project for new emergency department and medical unit.

2001 Hendricks Community Hospital opens the doors to the Thomas J. Hibelbun Surgery Center at Avon Station Medical Center.

1998 Hendricks Community Hospital opens the doors to the Brownsburg Medical Center, which features laboratory and radiology services and physician office space.

1997 Hendricks Community Cancer Center and Building 2 of Avon Station Medical Center open their doors for the first time.

1995 A massive internal building and renovation project within the Hendricks Community Hospital medical campus in Danville concludes. Many departments are enlarged and enhanced in the process, including the emergency department, outpatient services, radiology, physical and occupational therapy and speech therapy.

1995 Hendricks Community Hospital opens the Childbirth Center, located on a newly-added third floor. Medical Office Building 2 opens at Hendricks Community Hospital in Danville.

1993 Partners In Care, the Hendricks Community Hospital clinic for under-insured residents of Hendricks County, opens. Hendricks Community Hospital opens the doors to Avon Station Medical Center, a second satellite campus.

1990 Hendricks Community Hospital opens Stafford Pointe Medical Center in Plainfield, the first satellite campus, which includes physician offices, laboratory, radiology and physical therapy services.

1988 Hendricks County Hospital begins doing business as Hendricks Community Hospital, reflecting the increasing number of patients who live outside the Hendricks County area.

1987 Medical Office Building 1 opens at the Hendricks County Hospital medical campus in Danville.

1981 Broke ground on a 44,000 square-foot expansion for respiratory therapy, cardiology and emergency.

1973 Hendricks County Hospital undergoes a third expansion, which includes two additional operating rooms, additional examination rooms in the emergency department, a physical therapy department and an enlargement to remaining ancillary services, such as laboratory and radiology.

1971 Emergency department and ambulatory care facilities expanded.

1967 Hendricks County Hospital undergoes a significant expansion, adding a second floor of inpatient rooms.

1962 Hendricks County Hospital opens its doors with 70 beds.

1960 Groundbreaking for Hendricks County Hospital.
