Mrs. Cartlidge chose to make a generous gift from her estate before she passed away in July. Her daughter, Cathy Mekel, is proud that her mother's caring spirit will continue with this donation. This generous gift will be recognized in several ways. There will be a space at the Hendricks Regional Health YMCA that bears Mrs. Cartlidge's name and tells visitors about the story of her involvement and the significance of the location. The Cartlidge Circle has been created by the Foundation to encourage individuals and companies to make gifts of \$1,000 or more. Her aspirations of a new community center for Hendricks County will soon be reality thanks to her vision and determination, and her commitment to Hendricks Regional Health will continue to inspire support from others.

I would like to extend to you my heartfelt thanks for your investment in better health for Hendricks County and the region. Our 16-member Board of Directors oversees how your gifts are used. The focus for fund distribution is community outreach programs, especially those from which the hospital does not generate income.

*Programs like free health screenings.* Changes in deductibles and co-pays often keep people away from their doctors. Health screenings can identify those at risk and save lives. For many, this could be the only time they have their blood pressure checked or are screened for blood sugar and cholesterol levels, indicators of potential silent killers.

*Programs like free and low-cost prenatal classes.* These important classes, along with appropriate prenatal care, help ensure a healthy pregnancy outcome for mom and baby. As one of the only hospitals in the area to offer prenatal classes at no or very low cost, your support helps us decrease barriers to this valuable community outreach program.

*Programs like Partners in Care.* This clinic provides primary care and OB/GYN services for uninsured or underinsured patients from Hendricks County. Health care services are available at Hendricks Regional Health for everyone who needs them, regardless of ability to pay. And everyone receives the same “treat people better” care.

*Programs like assistance for mammograms in the hospital's Women's Center.* First-time grants announced in 2010 provide funds in 2011 for women without insurance to get mammograms and other required diagnostic tests, if indicated.

We are grateful that Foundation gifts are used to benefit people in our community.

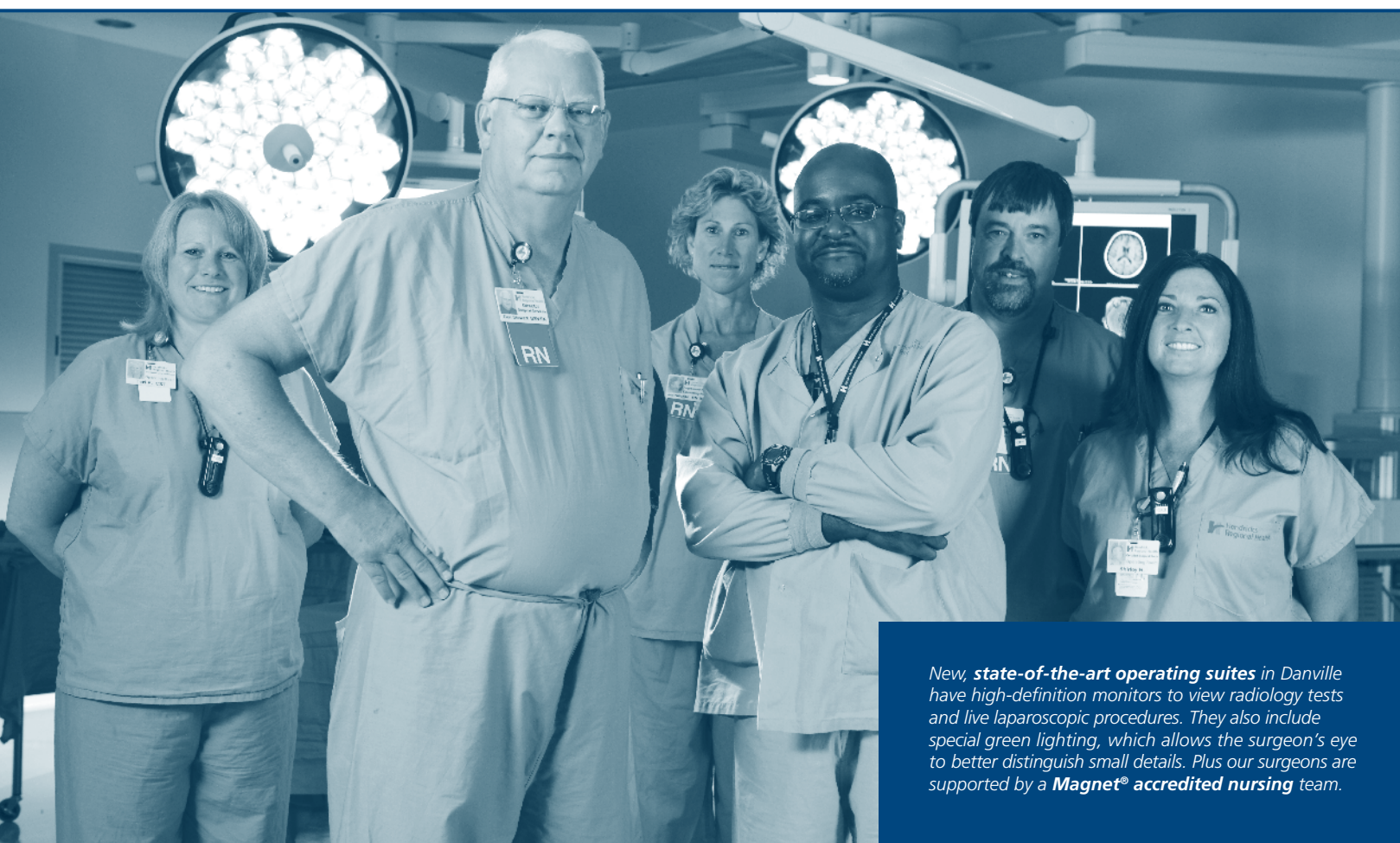
Hendricks Regional Health is Hendricks County's only nonprofit health system.

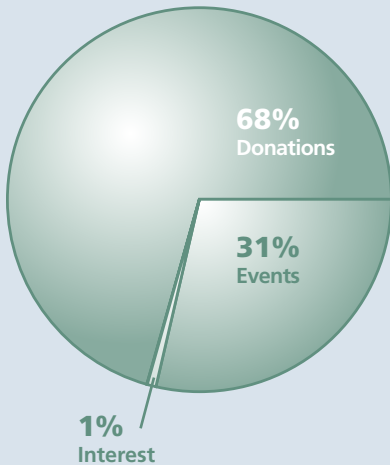

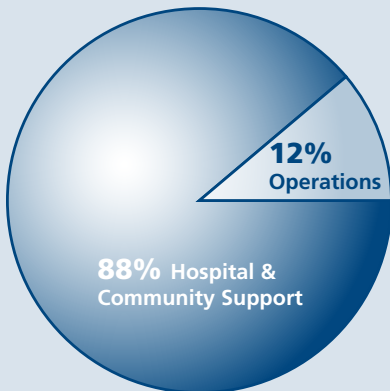
